Additional Academic Supports

Resources are organized into five categories: Course Content, Intermediate Learning Content, Multimedia Learning Objects, Public Exam and Final Exam Reviews.

The **Course Content** provides access to the course materials that CDLI educators use to teach their courses. This content is broken down by Unit and Intended Learning Outcome (ILO). The ILOs are the specific items that are covered in the courses.

The Intermediate Learning Content contains a series of recorded Multimedia Mathematics Tutorials covering a range of topics. The intermediate Learning Content area also contains support materials for the grade eight and nine Technology Education program.

The **Multimedia Learning Objects** are a series of recorded Multimedia resources that review concepts in selected 2000 and 3000 level senior high courses. There is also a series of Mathematics Tutorials reviewing a range of topics.

The **Public and Final Exam Reviews** are a series of recorded items which review constructed and selected response questions from previous Public. The reviewer explains in detail the approach used to answer a specific type of question, dealing with how to read a question and details to look for, and finally completing the solution for the student.

CDLI is proud to offer academic support to all students of Newfoundland and Labrador throughout the school year in the form of free tutoring services that are available both in-school and online. We concurrently operate three tutoring programs which support students in reaching their full academic potential.

Tutoring for Tuition (TFT)

Tutors are post-secondary students who are pursuing undergraduate degrees in the fields they are tutoring. They work throughout the school year from October to June and their services are available on evenings and weekends through our website www.cdli.ca/tutoring

Tutoring for Work Experience Program (TWEP)

Tutors are post-secondary students who are pursuing undergraduate degrees in the fields they are tutoring. During the months of May and June, students work full-time during evenings and weekends. During final exams, tutors are also available during the day through our website at www.cdli.ca/tutoring

E-Tutors

A CDLI e-tutor is a present or former distance education student chosen by the m-team (School personnel responsible for CDLI) to help support e-learning in their school in a variety of ways, from assisting with CDLI equipment to providing regular subject specific tutoring.
